

## **Dress Code**

- These dress rules are for the guidance of Members and visitors and are intended to be open, understandable and workable and to be consistent with standards of dress considered acceptable at modern-day Golf Clubs.
- The rules are not intended to be fully prescriptive, and are in some cases open to
  interpretation, but Members are expected to take personal responsibility for observing
  standards of dress that reflect well on themselves and Ballyclare Golf Club.
- Visitors, visiting societies, visiting teams and those participating in open competitions are
  required to comply with these dress rules. It is up to Members to ensure that their individual
  guests are advised accordingly.

Ballyclare Golf Club believes behaviour both in the clubhouse and on the Golf Course is more important than telling an individual how they should be dressed. However we do have some guidelines, so please observe the following.

## Clubhouse

Any smart casual clothing, including smart denim is acceptable in the Clubhouse, flip-flops, beach style shorts and football / rugby shirts, vest type shirts are not allowed.

We ask that you do not wear golf shoes of any type indoors, except in the locker rooms.

Shirts designed to be worn outside Trousers, Shorts or Skirts and all Modern Casual Shoes including Smart Trainers, Sandals, Loafers and Deck Shoes are permitted.

Dress code for private events will be smart casual except when invited by Captains or Presidents at which guests are requested to wear Jacket and tie for gentlemen. All other social events as above.

## **Golf Course**

The guideline is that any recognised golfing apparel that can be purchased from a professional golf retail outlet is acceptable excluding denims.

Shirts/ blouses that are designed to be worn outside the waistband are acceptable. Golf shorts should be tailored but shorts that are smart casual and deemed to be "golfing apparel" can be worn.

Beach shorts, denim, camouflage clothing, cargo and tracksuits are not allowed to be worn on the golf course.

Note that denim can be worn at the driving range, practice areas and putting greens but not on the golf course.
